## Description of Article:

Ring, lady's, platinum (stamped PLAT RC), custom cast manufacture, bright finish, flat, 9.0mm ballast weighted shank with concave leading edges, and straight, 12.4mm sides and solid shoulders. The top features an integrated, six prong tapered head, set with one (1), Round Brilliant diamond weighing approx. 6.22ct\* per the quality analysis on the following page of this report.

Each side is three row, channel set, with thirty (30), princess cut diamonds (total of 60), measuring approx.  $2.0 \times 2.0$ mm with an estimated individual weight of 0.05-0.06ct. The base of the shank is channel set with nine (9), princess cut diamonds measuring approx.  $2.0 \times 2.0$ mm with an estimated individual weight of 0.05-0.06ct. The base of the head features two, diagonally oriented, bezel set, princess cut diamonds measuring approx.  $2.3 \times 2.3$ mm with an estimated individual weight of 0.07ct. \* Total weight 3.83ct.

Each side is shared bead set with thirty six (36), round brilliant diamonds measuring approx. 1.0mm diameter with an estimated individual weight of 0.005ct. The leading edges and the bottom of the gallery are bead set with a total of forty (40), round brilliant diamonds measuring approx. 1.0-2.3mm in diameter with an estimated individual weight of 0.005- 0.05ct.\* Total weight 1.48ct.




